JAMES CHAPTER 1

1. If you begin to doubt God during difficult times and trials, what questions might you be asking about Him?
2. What does verse 2 remind you to do when trials arrive? Describe how you feel about taking this kind of action in the middle of a trial.
3. How do trials add to your maturity of faith?
4. What picture does James use to illustrate a doubter? And what is the resulting behavior of a doubter?
5. Why would you hesitate to ask God for wisdom?
6. Where else might a person look for help/wisdom? Where do you look for wisdom?
7. How might becoming rich or becoming poor might test your faith?
8. What besides money is important enough to you to test your faith?
9. How does the word "endure" in verse 12 change your perspective of endurance?
10. What is your greatest temptation? What concrete steps do you take to protect yourself from the temptation?

Bonus idea:

After looking at Chapter 1 write a prayer to God thanking and asking Him for whatever you sense this chapter is speaking to you about at this time in your life.

4. What is the “royal law” and what is the “law of liberty”?
5. Is favoritism/partiality/snobbery less sinful than adultery or murder?
6. What use is your faith?
7. What are the two words James uses about “faith” without works?
8. Describe “living” faith.
9. When have you offered faith and had no works to follow up?

1. Who in your house do you have the most trouble communicating with? Why?
2. Can you remember a time when your tongue was a blessing to someone? Describe this blessing.
3. How do you see the theme of “being a doer” in chapter 3?
4. If you could relay the conversation around your table last night, what would your talk reveal about your family? You?
5. What responsibility does God give the teacher in this passage?
6. Why is “disciplined speech” a part of spiritual maturity?
7. Do you have any personal experience with the three illustrations James uses for the tongue (horse, whip, fire)?
8. Can you recall a time when someone spoke to you in a “life-giving direction”?
9. Is there a word, sentence or general conversation you remember that wounded you deeply? When did the conversation take place? Who was the other speaker?
10. How often do you offer praise to God? What are the circumstances?

6. Why is “swearing”, “promising” or “vowing” discouraged?
 - a. Are the people in your world able to take your “yes” or “no” to the bank?
7. James tells us to do 2 things in verse 13. What are they?
8. If you sin, will illness come into your body?
9. Does God promise to heal us?
10. Why or how should we admit our sins to one another?
